You must watch, as Jesus said, if you would not have the house broken open; you think you are watching, but are you when the house is broken open? What would be thought of a watchman who let the place watched be burglarized? Would he be the right kind of a watchman? That is just why I named our paper, *Sentinel*, and on it, "Watch."

Now how should we watch? A guard who was watching on the side of the Union soldiers in time of the war, was walking up and down while on duty, when he suddenly *felt* the approach of the enemy — danger; so he began to sing, "Jesus, lover of my soul, Let me to thy bosom fly," etc., and the verse that did the work was, "Other refuge have I none, Hangs my helpless soul on thee," etc.; he gave up to God. He afterward talked with the man who said he approached with his gun to his shoulder to shoot the guard, and he said his arm fell and the rifle with it; he could not shoot. That was watching; we must *feel* the danger and lift our thought to God; He will save us.

If we do not feel the danger and go right on as though everything were all right, declaring you are all right, you cannot die, etc., when the seeming is all wrong, you will not be watching with God.

When we *feel* the danger, then we earnestly turn to God.

I watch my thoughts about people, the lame, the old, the unloved to sense that I pass in the street, stray animals, I except nothing. I have taken my radical stand for perfection and I will not, absolutely will not, relax this perfect standard.

The result has been simply marvelous. Try it and you will find that you forget your glasses; they will become unnecessary.

You will be seeing with God's eyes, His perfect sight, and you will behold a perfect universe, the outward condition of your inward thinking. To change the picture you must change the sight that produced the picture.

Recorded Healings by Mary Baker Eddy

The following is from a collection of healings achieved by Mrs. Eddy, included in the booklet, "The Overwhelming Evidence Concerning Spiritual Healings Through Mary Baker Eddy," compiled by Ralph Spencer. This booklet is available from Plainfield Church.

One day, a man whom Mrs. Eddy had seen jump from a great height, called to see her. He had on dark goggles. She asked him if he were not afraid when he took that leap. He explained to her that if he were to become afraid the jump was too high, he would be killed. After talking to him in a most heavenly way for some time, one could see by the expression of his face how enlightened he was mentally. Then she began again, and talked to him about his lack of fear, he still asserting that he had no fear when jumping — he knew he could do it.

She said to him, "why not apply the same rule to your eyes?" One, he told her, had been destroyed through an accident; the other was all right, but he wore dark goggles to hide the bad eye.

They were sitting in the library, and as she talked to him, I could see and feel that his fear was removed, and his thought was full of hope and joy, although he did not then realize the blessing he had received. A day or two afterwards, the cabman who drove him to the station reported there that he had two perfect eyes when he reached the station.

In the Bible we read, "But the men of Sodom were wicked and sinners before the Lord exceedingly."

Through the ages, the sin most commonly associated with Sodom has to do with some form of sexual mania. But the great poet, William Blake, sweeping away cobwebs of traditional theological and popular thought on this subject, uncovered an important, neglected, uncomfortable scripture shedding explicit light on Sodom's real, underlying problem, which at face value does not appear to be all that perverse, all that spectacular, and perhaps even trivial to modern readers: "Behold, this was the iniquity of thy sister, Sodom, pride, fullness of bread, and abundance of idleness . . . neither did she strengthen the hand of the poor and needy." (Ezek.)

God, help me to counter this compound sin, the sin of Sodom, in my own life. Let me embrace deeper depths of humility (obliterating pride); let me constantly hunger and thirst after righteousness in order to do away with being full of self, or full of yesterday's bread of Life — in other words, to empty myself of self (obliterating the self-satisfaction of "fullness of bread"); let me ever fulfill Mr. Carpenter's crucial "watching point" about being willing "to forget self and one's own desires, in order to help others . . . to be willing to be in service twenty-four hours a day with

A Wonderful Key

Published in Christian Science Weekly, January 19, 1899 from the Denver Republican

Through Christian Science, the sick and dying are healed; the slaves of sin and evil appetites, set free; the insane restored to reason; the otherwise incurably blind, deaf, and crippled, made whole; and this Science has been revealed to mankind in Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures, by Mary Baker G. Eddy.

These are facts, and yet, even those who have been healed in Christian Science sometimes complain of the distinction that is given Mrs. Eddy and her book in the church services and in the practice. The writer was one of those unreasonable persons.

Let us consider a parallel case. A man has been lying in a damp, deep dungeon — manacled hand and foot — ever since he can remember. He has been given keys from time to time, none of which would turn the bolts of his dungeon door or loosen the iron clasp of his fetters. His condition has excited the sympathy of men of all nations, and keys of the most cunning design have been sent to him. Some of them are very beautiful and almost fit, but an unseen flaw in the design makes them as useless as the key of crudest design which does not come near fitting the lock.

In the course of years, the prisoner has acquired a large and varied collection of keys. But finally he gives up all hope and concludes that the only escape for him will be death. Just at this time a woman offers him a key. He has tried so many that it seems folly to try another, but in a

half-hearted way he applies it to the lock of his ankle fetters, and lo! they are loosed. Then he tries the bands around his wrists, and they spring open. His joy at first is too great for words. He weeps tears of heartfelt gratitude. He goes to the door and tries the key in it. The bolts slowly slide back and the door opens. He is free!

There are locksmiths who have spent a lifetime trying to devise keys to unlock these dungeons. Some of these locksmiths are graduates of famous universities, where they have studied the literature of keys in every known language. They look at this wonderful key, and immediately pronounce it a fraud, without even trying it. They say it's just a composite of the notions of visionary key-makers of all ages — "Nothing new in it at all."

"That may be," says someone, "but this new key unlocked that dungeon door that no other key would unlock. How do you account for that?" "Well," responds the educated locksmith, "if it unlocked that door, it's the devil's work. It's my opinion that it was not the will of God that that man should ever get out."

Science and Health is more than a collection of truths from ancient and modern authors. It is the full revelation to mankind of the Principle of all Truth, which imparts spiritual understanding, by which one is enabled to separate the wheat from the chaff (Truth from error) in all that he reads, whether in ancient or modern literature. It is the Science of Being which leads into all Truth, all Life, and confers health, happiness, freedom, and abiding peace.

This great book opens the hidden meaning of the Scriptures. It is, in very truth, a "Key to the Scriptures."

The book 500 Watching Points was written by Gilbert C. Carpenter, C.S.B., and Gilbert C. Carpenter, Jr., C.S.B. These watching points were written for Mr. Carpenter's students, "to broaden their demonstration of Christian Science as Mrs. Eddy set the example in her home."

Watching Point No. 234 Gilbert C. Carpenter

WATCH lest you believe that you will need protection from the wind of error all your days, lest it blow out your spiritual flame. Will progress bring the demonstration that will enable you to know that the wind only causes your spiritual fire to burn more brightly? Surely this was true in the case of our Leader.

Protection from the winds must belong to the baby stage, where one's spiritual fire has not yet been kindled brightly. Protection in one's advanced stages is gained by reversing error upon itself, knowing that every effort evil makes to blow out one's spiritual fire, only causes it to burn more brightly.

When Gilbert Carpenter was at Mrs. Eddy's home, she taught him this rule of protection. She instructed him to handle every claim by knowing that he was the better and stronger for it, that every effort of error to harm him, only made him better and lifted him higher.

Let us suppose a claim of epidemic was rampant. How would you handle it? Could you not realize that error never created anything and never could. Therefore, the only epidemic must be the presence of God's encircling love, which mortal sense is distorting, and so we are stronger and better for Love's presence, and safe from all harm.

One sad thing about sickness under mortal mind is

that every attack leaves mortal man weaker and more fearful. Every time he is thrown down, he is weakened. In mythology we read about the giant, Antaeus, who was the son of Mother Earth. Every time he was thrown down, he rose up with renewed strength, infused into him by his contact with his mother. Thus we can realize in Christian Science that every time error claims to throw us down, it only serves to put us in contact with our Father-Mother God, from whom we derive a constant renewal of life.

To attempt to be sorrowful in God's kingdom would be like insisting upon starvation in the midst of plenty. "Weeping may endure for a night, but joy cometh in the morning." Joy is first to greet us when, having come through a night of discord, we receive healing in Christian Science.

The Bible makes constant references to joy. After the Jews had rebuilt the walls of Jerusalem, Nehemiah urged them to remember, "The joy of the Lord is your strength." Isaiah calls upon the waste places of Jerusalem to "break forth into joy." Jesus, speaking of the at-one-ment between himself and his disciples through their union with God, said, "These things have I spoken unto you, that my joy might remain in you, and that your joy might be full."

To live on the mount of revelation opens the way for continual messages of joy from God. When obeying the call of Spirit, we have nothing but good awaiting us. Courageously marching forward, we pass through the nothingness of evil into the glories of ever-present bliss. Hear the inspired words of Mary Baker Eddy: "Clad in invincible armor, grasping the sword of Spirit, you have started in this sublime ascent, and should reach the mount of revelation; for if ye would run, who shall hinder you? So dear, so due to God is *obedience*, that it reaches high heaven in the common walks of life, and it affords even me a perquisite of joy." (My.)

The world's standard of joy is a poor staff to lean upon, but spiritual joy stands the test of eternity.

The Carpenters' Divine Destiny

Here is an important question for the serious student of Christian Science to consider: "If you found evidence that Mary Baker Eddy spoke or acted inconsistent with her teaching, would not this discredit her and, therefore, her revelation?" The answer from the enemy of Christian Science is, "Of course!" But the answer of the student of Christian Scientist is more important.

Those who worked in close quarters with Mrs. Eddy, in her home, or those on the Board of Directors, were challenged by this question daily. Most judged her based upon the evidence of their "personal sense," either hating her and turning away, or tolerating her with the patronizing "she is making a loving mistake!" The latter evolved into the official position of the church hierarchy, and turned it into a Gestapo-like, take-no-prisoners method of operation, fiercely pursuing every shred of historical content surrounding Mrs. Eddy, and hiding it in "the Archives," only allowing carefully vetted people to peek, under close scrutiny — all to prevent embarrassing trivia regarding Mrs. Eddy to reach Christian Scientists and confuse them, or to reach the general public and bring ridicule upon the movement!

One saintly man, Gilbert Carpenter, Sr., took a different approach, and took Mrs. Eddy at her word: "I briefly declare that nothing has occurred in my life's experience which, if correctly narrated and understood, could injure me." (Christian Science Sentinel, 3/12/10). During his one year of service in her home, Mr. Carpenter had observed

Mrs. Eddy in operation. He did not pass judgment upon her on any point, but, rather, quietly thought and prayed about his experience. He reasoned that anyone who was fit to discover and found Christian Science, a divine revelation, could not possibly be understood from a personal, human point of view. After nearly 1900 years, Mrs. Eddy was the first to "get it." The difference between her writings and the finest Christian theologians is like night and day. Even the highly regarded Christian, St. Augustine, whom she respectfully referred to in her writings, presented a very human rendering, a mere shadow of the spiritual power underlying the Christianity Mrs. Eddy revealed.

And so Mr. Carpenter, we might say, waited on God for 25 years before sharing his insight on Mrs. Eddy with others. In fact, he was impelled to set the record straight after several books (Dittemore, Dakin, etc.) dragged her through the mud of unpleasant criticism. In his precious books, "Mary Baker Eddy, Her Spiritual Footsteps" and "Mary Baker Eddy, Her Spiritual Precepts," Mr. Carpenter, with the aid of his son, Gilbert, Jr., addressed many difficult-tounderstand incidences in her home at Pleasant View and letters to the Board of Directors. Whereas others used this same material to illustrate Mrs. Eddy's weaknesses, Mr. Carpenter convincingly explained how, in fact, she was demonstrating Christian Science in the smallest details of her life! She was constantly striving to obey God as best she could, ever watchful of the encroachment of the so-called human mind, that which thinks and acts to please man instead of God. It is the nature of things that those who habitually please man before God do not like to have it pointed out!! And so, dear Mrs. Eddy bore this cross, pointing out deficiencies of her students along this line and bearing the consequences through to her passing, and we expect, her ascension.

The Carpenters' Divine Destiny

The vision of the Carpenters was diametrically opposed to the "party-line" of the Christian Science Board of Directors, and for their courage and love in quietly fulfilling their divine destiny right under the nose of the Great Red Dragon, we can never be grateful enough. Now the student of Christian Science can face the "dirty secrets" about Mrs. Eddy and gain greater, not less, respect for her, and grow to a much higher understanding and demonstration of Christian Science. The advancing student who avoids knowing more about how Mrs. Eddy practiced this Science, and drowns themselves in reading more and more metaphysics, is handicapped.

Mary Baker Eddy wrote of "each waiting hour," but she also wrote "wake to know a world more bright." Sometimes the only thing we can seem to do is wait patiently on God, but let us not get so absorbed in waiting that it merges into dull self-mesmerism. If there is "a time to every purpose under the heaven," as the Bible says, there is not only a time to wait, but also a time to get up and do something!

Paul's counsel, "Having done all, to stand" is very good advice; and yet it is the experience of most of us that when we *really* have done all, we seldom have to stand very long. When human will, pride, self-justification, and specific outlining are eliminated, we soon see the solution to our problem — which has been at hand all the time.

What seems to be one of the favorite devices of the adversary is to keep us waiting, in the stupefying belief that we must wait indefinitely. Yet when the world is in distress, that's a great opportunity to rouse the world from its long sleep of materiality! The carnal mind had been sleeping for so many centuries in its self-satisfied belief of life in matter. It struck out fiercely right and left when a firm hand was laid upon its shoulder, and the voice of Truth was heard saying, "Awake thou that sleepest, and arise from the dead." Error fights back with the stubborn, desperate resistance of that which knows its time is short.

We need never be disturbed by world tribulations, when we see in it only what Elijah saw when the 450 priests of Baal sought to establish the supremacy of their god by a sign from heaven. All day long they shouted and clamored

and "cried aloud"; and all day long Elijah, the one and only prophet of the true God, stood aside and watched them with the patience of the man who knows. Then, when noise and bluster had done all it could and had accomplished nothing, he stepped forward, and with quietness and confidence, offered a brief, simple prayer to the God of Israel, which received its immediate answer.

World Must Discover that Hope Is in God Only

This world has for ages turned in vain to matter and materialistic philosophy for deliverance from its woes, and in disregard of its own declaration that God, Spirit, or Omniscience is all power, and regardless, too, of the fact that the divine Mind alone can govern man aright, can alone wipe away tears and heal all of the diseases of the nation.

The profundity of Mrs. Eddy's announcement that the only hope of humanity lies in the direction of Mind has been recognized slowly; but, in spite of all reluctance and dimness of spiritual discernment, the world must awaken to that discovery. In the future the only march of actual progress will be in the mental realm, and this progress will not be in the way of human speculation and theorizing, but in the actual understanding and demonstration of the Mind that is infinite God, Good.

Lesson: Doctrine of Atonement

Moses went up to the mountain to receive the Ten Commandments, and when he came down, he found that the people had gone back to idol worship. So the day of atonement was established as a day to purify from sin. But if Christian Scientists believe there is no sin, what does that mean to us?

Christian Scientists often consider atonement as simply "at-one-ment with God." But what does that really mean? What is the process? The process is self-immolation, daily purification of thought and daily deeds, "bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ," whereby man reflects divine Truth, Life, and Love. This reflection of Truth, Life, and Love is serving the living God.

Mary Baker Eddy says, "In proportion to a man's spiritual progress, he will indeed drink of our Master's cup, and be baptized with his baptism! be purified as by fire, — the fires of suffering; then hath he part in Love's atonement, for 'whom the Lord loveth He chasteneth.'" (Mis.) So if you're progressing spiritually, there's no way you're going to avoid this. And what you're being purified of is sin, disease, and death.

Purging Ourselves of Sin and Guilt

In the Lesson it says to purge your conscience so that you may serve the living God. We have to purge our lives,

change the way we live our lives, and stay in continual touch with what is truly right, what Jesus taught us. In the course of this, we then have a clear conscience so we can serve the living God — we're not all wrapped up in guilt. Instead of a life of guilt for all the sins we've committed, Mrs. Eddy comes along and says, there is no forgiveness without reformation. So stop looking for forgiveness without reformation, stop looking for God to pardon us.

Mrs. Eddy also says constant self-immolation is necessary. If you're a Christian Scientist and walking around with a lot of guilt, you can't practice Christian Science. How can you when you're feeling guilty? It totally incapacitates you. You have to squarely face that first and come through it. If you have committed a sin and you are guilty, you have to make amends — first to God, and to anyone else, and certainly to yourself — and then you can move on, and get your peace with God.

Anxiety Is Disobedience to God

If you are feeling anxious, that is guilt. If you are perennially anxious, then you are basically sinning in some way and not doing anything about it. Mrs. Evans used to say if you are feeling anxious, it's disobedience to God. You're allowing negativity, ingratitude, or some other thing to infiltrate your thinking. What a sin that is! It will control you and drive you until you see it and kick it out. Then you can start anew; then you're ready for progress.

People take medication and go through therapy because anxiety is this mysterious thing. It's not mysterious at all, and we shouldn't make it mysterious. It's something that needs to be met. If you're chronically anxious, you can't serve the living God.

Another problem in today's society with the medical is they're trying to find ways around taking responsibility for

sin. Mrs. Eddy is very clear on that in the chapter on Prayer — you're pardoned when you stop sinning. Mrs. Eddy says, "Prayer, watching, and working, combined with selfimmolation" People say, oh, yes, I'm watching, working and praying. But they miss the self-immolation part; they completely overlook that. It's nothing to fear, because as you grow spiritually, God gives you whatever you need to overcome whatever is assailing you. It's just a natural outcome of your spiritual growth. It's nothing to fear or dread. But you do have to suffer through sin in order to purge yourself of it. It's healthy and life-giving. Mrs. Eddy also says, "The atonement is a hard problem in theology, but its scientific explanation is, that suffering is an error of sinful sense which Truth destroys, and that eventually both sin and suffering will fall at the feet of everlasting Love." (S&H)

Jesus proved by demonstration that we must overcome everything so there is nothing we are the victim of — even to the point of overcoming death. Mrs. Eddy says every time you overcome one of these little things, you are actually overcoming the belief of death. Every time you have a healing, every time you correct a negative thought, you're overcoming death. So why not do it now, get started with it, and be faithful to it? Then we're following his example. That is substantive religion.

The Lamb Destroys the Wolf

It's intriguing to think why the Lamb can destroy the wolf. The wolf is sin. Innocence would be the only thing that could destroy it, because it has the whole power of God behind it. Mrs. Eddy says, "Truth, Life, and Love are a law of annihilation to everything unlike themselves, because they declare nothing except God." (S&H) "Divine Science shows how the Lamb slays the wolf. Innocence and

Truth overcome guilt and error." The wolf is guilt and error? That's really big. It's not this big, evil force — it's guilt and error. Innocence and purity are not something fragile — here she's saying it destroys the wolf! With innocence and purity, there's no way the wolf can reach you, and so you annihilate it. You need to cleanse yourself and get rid of that guilty conscience, then there's no hook in you for the wolf to grab onto. You end up destroying it. And the kingdom of Heaven is within you.

Face the Demons of the Past, and Move On!

If you look back at your human history, there are going to be things that would try to create that guilt. That's why we have to face the demons in our past and move on. A good way to tell the difference between legitimately facing a sin, and animal magnetism — if something from the past comes up, if there's nothing you can do about it, that's animal magnetism. You can turn it into a steppingstone with, "I can't do anything about that, but I can strive to do better in the future." But if it leaves you with the feeling, "I should have done better" — that's trying to drag you down. That's not the way God works. God does not condemn, ever!

In the Bicknell Young article, "Death Overcome," he had led a pretty good life. When he found himself at the bottom of a lake, the accuser came in. If he didn't know his Science, he would not have survived. He tells that the louder the error spoke, the louder he argued, until he shot up out of the lake, and lived to tell the story.

"The atonement requires constant self-immolation on the sinner's part. That God's wrath should be vented upon His beloved Son, is divinely unnatural." We are empowered to do this, as we're honest and faithful in our self-immolation. It's an ongoing thing, not a condemning thing. Take the true atonement and use it, so you're ready to serve God!

Last week's Lesson was Doctrine of Atonement, this week Probation after Death, next week Everlasting Punishment, and then Adam and Fallen Man. Ouch! What was Mrs. Eddy thinking? What was God thinking? I thought God is Love?

Response:

"For every man shall bear his own burden." Well, if we're all bearing our own burdens (and as we learned in last week's Lesson, Christ didn't relieve us of a single responsibility), then I guess we need to keep examining ourselves and talking about "sin" until it's completely handled. Otherwise it becomes a tremendous burden. I feel like I've been carrying around 40 years of that burden, and it's only at this church that I'm slowly grasping the concepts of self-immolation and learning the "practical repentance" that chips away at and destroys that sin.

And what freedom to be rid of the perennial guilt hid-

den under the facade of "I am a perfect child of God" when referring to the "mortal self!" Yes, Mrs. Eddy saw the danger from the beginning, as did Paul: "For, brethren, ye have been called unto liberty; only use not liberty for an occasion to the flesh, but by love serve one another." (Gal.) These tough Lesson subjects, one after another, are intended to get our attention so that we do not drift off into the quicksand of impractical metaphysics, into selfish, self-centered harmony.

And yet the "culture" floats over these subjects. "Pay no attention to that man (sin) behind the curtain." To think I used to travel every year for class association to be lectured on the letter of Science! Not once was I taught that I needed to atone for my sin so that I may manifest my true nature — a son of God who has dominion over sin and evil. Science shows us how to put off the old man step by step, day by day, in a practical manner. And this church has not lost sight of that!

"Between us and you there is a great gulf fixed: so that they which would pass from hence to you cannot; neither can they pass to us, that would come from thence."

Seems pretty hopeless if you're on the wrong side of that gulf! But God does not condemn. So, what is this gulf?

In Luke, "No servant can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon." The great gulf must be the gulf between materiality and spirituality; between love and hate; between selflessness and selfishness. One or the other rules your heart. There is no grey zone here. No connection between the two opposite states of thought — hence the need for

constant self-examination. I am either in a selfless state of divine love, or I am way over on the other side of that great gulf, in the hell of selfish materialism and the hatred that goes with it.

Response:

It has been said that this is not a parable, since Jesus never used actual names in parables. Rather he was recounting what he saw "on the other side" — past the veil of matter. The rich man was in a bad way — looks like he was being punished for being such a selfish man, and that it was eternal damnation. But Mrs. Eddy explains: "the belief in sin is punished so long as the belief lasts," so we may be sure that the rich man was crying out for help, but without a modicum of repentance. When we are struggling with a hellish situation, we would do well to remember this. Feeling sorry for ourselves does not constitute repentance!!

Response:

What a very important point. The rich man seemed to get that it was his actions that put him there, which is why he wanted to send a warning to his brothers; but he did not repent or ask forgiveness. I just listened to the excellent Hezekiah Bible Study and the discussion of how he repented and wept sore. The rich man didn't like being in pain, but there was no change of heart and no break in his pride whatsoever. I love how these Lessons weave together to reinforce teachings.

Response:

This is perhaps the most arresting of all the examples Jesus gave of the need to progress and live righteously. Thank God for Mrs. Eddy's wonderful help. But the challenge is great.

A Major Healing

Last Wednesday night on my way home from work, I received word that my mother had been rushed to the hospital. I immediately turned to God in prayer, thanking Him for His ever-present love. I prayed all the way to the hospital, and every time thoughts of fear threatened, I would thank God even more for His goodness and mercy.

When I arrived at the hospital, my mother was hooked up to an EKG machine, which showed evidence of a heart attack. My mother is not a Christian Scientist — she was moaning and talking negatively. Then I received the angel message to play the Wednesday night testimony service. At first my mother didn't want to listen; but then she closed her eyes and, after a while, quieted down. Then she appeared to drift off to sleep. The service was almost over when Mary Beth began to share the story of Jesus and Pilate. She said that after Pilate told Jesus that he had the power to crucify him, Jesus responded by saying, "you couldest have no power at all against me, except it were given thee from above." Then she went on to say that a doctor's diagnosis has no power over thee.

My mother's eyes opened wide and she sat straight up. She heard what Mary Beth said and it made an impression

on her, so much so that she started repeating, "The doctor's diagnosis has no power over me." Immediately after the service ended, the practitioner responded to my prayer request with a message of love and healing. Shortly afterwards, my mother said, "Let's go, I feel better! That woman is right, the doctor's diagnosis has no power over me!" Then she unhooked herself from the machine and we left the hospital, praising God. My mother still hasn't stopped talking about it, and is now in perfect health.

Thank God, for this church, and for the practitioner who loved us and helped us to rise above the battlefield on the wings of Truth and Love.

Given Thee from Above

In the book of John, chapter 19, there are two verses that have meant a great deal to me. This chapter describes the dark events that led up to the crucifixion of Jesus Christ. In verse 10, Pilate, with all the arrogance of a godless man, jeeringly asks Jesus, "Knowest thou not that I have power to crucify thee, and power to release thee?" Jesus' stirring answer echoes down through all ages with mighty import for us all: "Thou couldest have no power at all against me, except it were given thee from above"! His total conviction of the fact that God is the one and only Power and that there is no other lesser power, was what enabled Jesus to overcome completely all the wicked beliefs of hatred, pain, sin,

and even death itself — an everlasting victory! The holiness of this event is unspeakable.

Jesus' unflinching example under such dire straits shocked me into asking myself, how many times do I attribute power to something other than to God? I was not pleased with my answer and realized it was all too easy to be duped into believing this lie of a power apart from God. Mrs. Eddy speaks of a God-principle in Science and Health: "The God-principle is omnipresent and omnipotent. God is everywhere, and nothing apart from Him is present or has power." So I began the process of "unwinding my snarls" and to align myself with this operative principle, a law of God I could trust in. I would frequently remind myself that there was no power apart from God and to make sure I did not believe otherwise. Great changes began to take place. I began to have a sense of peace and joy that I had never before known to be possible. In some small way a resurrection was taking place, a resurrection out of the bondage and tyranny of the human mind.

It is good to ask oneself often, "Do I believe someone or something has a power over me other than God Almighty?" Is it a boss? Is it a domineering family member or friend? Is it the government? Does it call itself a doctor's verdict? Is it the bullying tactics of mortal mind you have allowed to stream through your consciousness unchecked? If so, now is your time to stand up and challenge these insidious suggestions with the words of our Master, "Thou couldest have no power at all against me, except it were given thee from above"! Mrs. Eddy told her students, "Error comes to you for life and you give it all the life it has." Think of this! Don't give the belief in error a power it doesn't have! The Kingdom of God is within you. God *is* the only power and you can begin today, this very moment, to prove this wonderful Truth to be the truth about you!

When I came into Christian Science, I felt I was a secondclass citizen. I did not have a college education, a prestigious job, or a lot of money. I only had a desire to learn about God.

A practitioner told me that, as a child of God, I was a first-class citizen. My spiritual growth and putting God first was more important than education, employment, or money.

The Bible says, "Seek ye first the kingdom of God, and His righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you." I should not go to God for material things, but for spiritual growth. In Isaiah it says, "If ye be willing and obedient, ye shall eat the good of the land." And the Moffat interpretation is, "If you are willing and obedient, ye shall feed on the best of the land." No second class in that!

I was instructed to make sure I could see the Reader in the church service and not sit behind someone who might block my view. I was told to go to the butcher and the vegetable market and buy the best meat and vegetables, to buy good clothes, not cheap and of poor quality. Since they were first quality, they cost more, but the money would be provided by God to pay for them, and it always was.

All these were practical lessons. As my thought lifted, I realized that I really was a child of God. Over the years I have had some challenging times, but as a first-class child of God, every need has been provided, and more so. I have had many opportunities to serve God — and that's the best riches anyone could ever want!



In James we read, "Resist the devil and he will flee from you." This should be a source of strength and comfort to anyone who believes that there is a real force, called devil, that has power to harm. Early in Jesus' mission, he was tempted by the devil, but the devil could not make him do anything. And when Jesus resisted the devil, the devil left him and angels ministered unto him.

What is the devil, that we can and should resist? In the Christian Science textbook, Mary Baker Eddy defines "Devil" as "a belief in sin, sickness, and death." Here, she makes it very clear that sin, sickness, and the belief in death are the devil, and they therefore can, and should, be resisted. They are not to be considered as a legitimate fact of life, or inevitable. No! They are to be resisted.

There are countless stories of men and women who have resisted cancer and other verdicts of hopeless disease, and have been healed solely by their change of thought. The fact that some have done it is proof that anyone can do it.

Here, Christian Science is the pearl of great price. It explains why the devil flees when we resist it. God made man in His image and likeness. That likeness does not include disease. When you resist a belief in some fearsome disease, you are resisting that which God did not make or ordain. It is therefore illegitimate, and does not deserve to have the power it claims to have. It claims to have power over man, but it is Godless; therefore powerless before the power of God. Mrs. Eddy states in the textbook, "Rise in the strength of Spirit to resist all that is unlike good. God has made man capable of this, and nothing can vitiate the ability and power divinely bestowed on man."
