With Science and Health for their textbook, I am astounded at the apathy of some students on the subject of sin and mental malpractice, and their culpable ignorance of the workings of these — and even the teacher's own deficiency in this department. I can account for this state of mind in the teacher only as the result of sin; otherwise, his own guilt as a mental malpractitioner, and fear of being found out.

The helpless ignorance of the community on this sub-

ject is pitiable, and plain to be seen. May God enable my students to take up the cross as I have done, and meet the pressing need of a proper preparation of heart to practise, teach, and live Christian Science! Your means of protection and defense from sin are, constant watchfulness and prayer that you enter not into temptation and are delivered from every claim of evil, till you intelligently know and demonstrate, in Science, that evil has neither prestige, power, nor existence, since God, good, is All-in-all.

"Christian Science declares that sickness is a belief, a latent fear, made manifest on the body in different forms of fear or disease. This fear is formed unconsciously in the silent thought, as when you awaken from sleep and feel ill, experiencing the effect of a fear whose existence you do not realize; but if you fall asleep, actually conscious of the truth of Christian Science, — namely, that man's harmony is no more to be invaded than the rhythm of the universe, — you cannot awake in fear or suffering of any sort." (Ret.)

This comforting statement by Mrs. Eddy from "Retrospection and Introspection" was given to me by a practitioner years ago when I had sleeping problems. She explained to me the importance of preparing thought before bedtime, to become enveloped with the Omnipotence, Omnipresence and Omniscience of our loving Father; to lay aside any troubles and to put them all in His care, and then to recount the wonderful blessings of the day, thanking God for each one. I was also given the following verse from Psalm 31:5 to work with: "Into Thine hand I commit my spirit: Thou hast redeemed, me O Lord God of Truth."

It was explained, too, if I did awake during the night, this would be a quiet and an effective time to pray for our church, community, nation and world. Mrs. Eddy states on page 218 of Science and Health: "The consciousness of Truth rests us more than hours of repose in unconsciousness." As I earnestly prayed in this manner, eventually a peace would take hold and sleep would return. The morning came with feelings of true refreshment and joy.

These simple guidelines for a God-given rest have never failed me, and you can trust them to help you as well!

Recorded Healings by Mary Baker Eddy

The following is from a collection of healings achieved by Mrs. Eddy, included in the booklet, "The Overwhelming Evidence Concerning Spiritual Healings Through Mary Baker Eddy," compiled by Ralph Spencer. This booklet is available from Plainfield Church.

Miss Ellen C. Pillsbury, of Tilton, N.H., was suffering from what her physicians called enteritis, of the severest form, following typhoid fever. Her case was given up by her regular physician, and she was lying at the point of death, when Mrs. Eddy visited her.

In a few moments after Mrs. Eddy entered the room and stood by the bedside, Miss Pillsbury recognized her aunt and said, "I am glad to see you aunty." In about ten minutes more, Mrs. Eddy told her to rise from her bed and walk. Miss Pillsbury rose and walked seven times across her room, then sat down in a chair.

For two weeks before this we had not entered her room without feeling obliged to step lightly. Her bowels were so tender that she felt the jar, and it increased her sufferings. She could only be moved on a sheet from bed to bed. When she walked across the room, at Mrs. Eddy's bidding, Mrs. Eddy told Miss Pillsbury to stamp her foot strongly upon the floor, and she did so without suffering from it. The next day she was dressed, and went down to the table; and on the fourth day made a journey of about a hundred miles in the cars.

This section contains excerpts from The Christian Science Weekly, which was first published in 1898, and later was renamed the Christian Science Sentinel.

Interview with Edward A. Kimball

The following was published in the Chicago Chronicle and was reprinted in the Christian Science Weekly on December 8, 1898. It reports an interview with Edward A. Kimball regarding a law case going on at the time in which Christian Scientists were being prosecuted.

Few people who knew E. A. Kimball twelve or fourteen years ago, when he was compelled by disease to terminate his business career, would recognize the same man now in the E. A. Kimball who has attained to great prominence in this city as standing for what he holds to be the truth of Christian Science. Many men who are still in active business will remember this same Mr. Kimball as having terminated his highly successful career in consequence of an ailment which brought him near to the brink of the grave, but for which the physicians had no certain name and no remedies that seemed to be applicable in the particular case. Many persons in Chicago will also remember that he traveled extensively in this country and in foreign countries, seeking health and apparently not finding it. At last, however — some ten or twelve years since — he appeared in this city again, a changed man, in perfect health and buoyant spirits. It is not for the Sunday Chronicle to say how he was healed, but it may be allowed to report Mr. Kimball as saying that he was healed by mental influence exerted upon him by Christian Scientists. Anyhow, he was

cured, and today he is to every appearance a well, strong, and forceful man. The present writer had known him well for a number of years, and he seemed doomed to early death and was known then to be a helpless invalid. Seen now, he is a picture of health. He is an excellent subject for the Christian Scientists to talk upon, for once he was as good almost as dead, and now he is very much alive. And besides, he, by his candor, forces upon one the conviction that he is entirely sincere in his belief in the actuality and practicability of Christian Science.

Mr. Kimball has, in fact, ever since his restoration to health, devoted his best energies and all his available time and very considerable sums of money to the cause of Christian Science. He was one of the organizers of the First Church of Christ, Scientist, now occupying its large new edifice on Drexel Boulevard near Fortieth Street. He is First Reader to the congregation there, which is the largest Protestant congregation in the United States.

Mr. Kimball here reminded this interviewer that it is now more than 32 years since Christian Science was discovered, and 32 years precisely since healing by Christian Science was first attempted. He asserted that during that time a million and a half sick cases have been cured in this country alone. Many of these were regarded, from the standpoint of the doctors, of the most stubborn and incurable nature. In the city of Chicago alone as many as five thousand Christian Science treatments are given every day.

He added this astonishing statement: "In eighteen years of Christian Science practice, not one hundred patients have died." Mr. Kimball mentioned the following incident, which he contends aptly illustrates the one-sided and intolerant attitude taken by many people toward the occasional loss of a case under Christian Science treatment. "A certain man took special delight in handing from

time to time to his son-in-law, who is a believer in Christian Science, newspaper cuttings recording the death of persons under Christian Science treatment. One day in handing one of these cuttings to him, he was given, in turn, the daily paper and asked to note the fact that that day's paper alone recorded over seventy people who had passed on under the treatment of the physicians. As each case represented a given failure on the part of the medical profession to master a definite case of disease, why were not these failures also telegraphed from north to south and from east to west? There were no comments made on either side, but the son-in-law was given no more clippings of the kind to ponder over."



Testimony – November 3, 1898

Mortal sense would tell us that we are so far from others who are interested in our Cause, that sometimes it would delude us if possible, into a seeming coldness in our work; but we try to press on, knowing that others have trod the thorn-road and we must follow in their footsteps if we would gain the demonstrations which it is ours, as followers of Truth, to make.

When we came here five years ago, Christian Science was unknown. Now we have a little band of earnest workers, and our regular services every Sunday.

We have started a Christian Science Fund, and although opposition seems to scorn us and deride our Cause, we have gained ground ever since we began our meetings. At first it seemed quite a difficult thing to secure

a place in which to meet, as this country was so new and all the houses so very small; but Truth is omnipotent and it was again proven to us. A gentleman who had seen some demonstrations and recognized the good in Christian Science, purchased Science and Health, and after reading it a short time, offered us his parlor for our meetings. His wife presides at the organ, and we are far better provided for than we could have planned for ourselves.

Although forsaken by earthly relatives, and, according to their view of things, some of us are "eternally lost," we have found that peace which the world cannot give.


Watching Point No. 98 Gilbert C. Carpenter

This error is exemplified by the student who mistakenly believes it is Science to affirm, "I am prosperous, I am healthy, I am happy." Such affirmations are no better than an attempt to graft holiness on unholiness, if the "I" the student has in mind is still mortal man.

The only time one can rightly affirm, "I am the image and likeness of God," is when his conception of "I" has risen above imperfection and fleshliness. Otherwise his effort descends to what is called mind-cure, or reaching out for the so-called good side of mortal sense, instead of trying to throw off all mortal sense. Mind-cure, or New Thought, tries to bring man good mortality; Science strives to do man good, by regenerating him spiritually.

A lifetime of bad habits doesn't always go easily. I found this to be true in my own experience. You have to be willing to fight and to stay in the battle until the victory is won, and then be willing to stay with it. A little here or there when you are feeling "in the mood" definitely doesn't work. Thank God that "Christian Science is the sovereign panacea, giving strength to the weakness of mortal mind." What encouragement Mrs. Eddy gives us!

Response:

Where else but Plainfield do we Scientists hear of this "mighty struggle"? In all my life I have never heard it spoken of in these practical ways. I grew up thinking that I was perfect. When I was sick or had a problem or encountered an error, I often heard "know the truth about it." This made Science mental or human, I suppose, rather than feeling the danger or error through your spiritual sense and intu-

itions, and then raising thought to God to destroy the seeming error. This other way ignored the problem as unreal, not a problem to really handle.

So I read about this mighty struggle in the Plainfield lesson and I feel encouraged when I am sick or faced with setting aside my passions or personal pursuits and selfish desires, because it is part of the process of laying aside the mortal for the immortal. I can't believe all these years I didn't get it. But I do now and that is important.

Response:

And as the Lesson points out so well, if we don't make this effort (and it has to be a consistent effort), then we effectively condemn ourselves to the vagueries of mortal beliefs, which seems like everlasting punishment. This effort begins in my own consciousness ("Let the reign of divine Truth, Life, and Love be established in me, and rule out of me all sin"), and then it has to take up everything in our experience that is opposed to the Truth ("who is telling mankind of the foe in ambush?"), out of love for our fellow man. This gives me plenty of work to do every day, and for this good work to do, I am very grateful!

What Is Required of Me?

I have heard this question often from this church. I love how it turns my thought to look within my own heart. Mrs. Eddy repeatedly asked her students to do this, and I am sure she is asking us now to do the same.

What is required of me to stay out of bondage? The Lesson tells us "But Jerusalem which is above is free, which is the mother of us all." (Gal.) The Lesson also clearly distinguishes the work of the flesh and the fruit of the Spirit. There is no confusion here. The real question becomes, "But now, after that ye have known God, or rather are

known of God, how turn ye again to the weak and beggarly elements, whereunto ye desire again to be in bondage?" (Gal.) I know better now, the ball is in my court, and the might of God is on my side to help me stay the course!

Response:

This is a wonderful example of not simply reading through the Lesson, but bringing it home and making it practical! — seeing how the Lesson is structured to guide you — not simply a bunch of nice citations!

"One Way"

There is no excuse to remain ignorant of this truth once the lesson in Science is learned. I was born free, as every man also was; it's up to me to choose the right way. Only the spiritual foundation guarantees my lasting freedom, and it's worth striving to maintain that as my source for everything I think and do, because "His foundation is in the holy mountains." (Ps.)

Mrs. Eddy's Work for the World David Keyston

Three times a day Mrs. Eddy took time to work for the Cause of Christian Science and for all the world. There were those in Germany, it is related, that tried for three years to bring about the first world war. But Mrs. Eddy was working, and this evil intent could not be accomplished then.

Similarly, it was not until right after Mrs. Eddy's passing (December 3, 1910) that three monumental events took place in this country, which have served to keep the populace in bondage to political and financial enterprise ever since. Was it merely coincidental that two of these three major developments were also significant planks in Karl

Marx's *Communist Manifesto*, serving to erode individual rights and liberty, giving socialism its first stranglehold on this country, what many believe to be the culminating ultimate social and political evil.

These few paragraphs but chronicle an isolated item of interest. These events were the following:

- 1) The Federal Reserve Bank a centralized banking system,
- 2) a graduated tax system,
- 3) the popular election of senators.

Additionally, the formation of the League of Nations (the fore-runner of the United Nations), was about this time. The first step in the destruction, or subordination of this God-inspired and ordained nation to international interests, subverting our sovereignty and nationalism to outside interests, was put in place.

What evil Mrs. Eddy kept at bay while she was here we may never fully know or appreciate. James Gilman relates the following on this topic (*Recollections of Mary Baker Eddy*, p. 48): ". . . malicious animal magnetism had been trying all over the land to precipitate evil leading into all sorts of sin and destruction, seeking to lay its work to Christian Scientists, but said she, 'I have been holding it back.'" (As we mentioned in the beginning of this book, a whole volume could be written on what work Mrs. Eddy did for the world in holding crime and evil in check.)

"Mrs. Eddy once told her household: 'If I should be taken from you, the students will have to do a great deal of work for the universal welfare, to make up for what I have done.'

"They say our dear Leader went aside three times a day to pray for the whole wide world.... Mrs. (Sue Harper) Mims told me that Mrs. Eddy did not need that anyone

should tell her the affairs of the nations, because her spiritual insight was such that she knew the conditions of every Court in Europe. The world was her patient, and she knew the needs of her patient. She gave us the (Christian Science) *Monitor* partly to make world-workers of us. We must know the needs of our patient (the world) and meet them spiritually and daily."

Law of Adjustment

 $T_{\rm o}$ be faithful to the Christ-idea is to come under a divine law of harmony of adjustment. This law does not operate from the basis of human knowledge and ingenuity, but from Principle, and it ensures justice in God's way.

Human existence seems constantly to be calling for decisions. The cry goes up, "What shall I do?" The vital question is, "What shall I think?"

When a decision is to be made, if the motive is right, the final outcome of the decision cannot fail to be good. The least important part of a decision is the decision itself. It is not so much what is done, as what is the motive and what is the point of view.

Once having established that our motive is right and that we have implicit trust in the law of God as fulfilling the ends of justice, what remains to be done? To be faithful to our trust, to dwell in the Christ-consciousness, to be willing and watchful as working Christian Scientists. Then the law of God will prove to be a law of adjustment, arranging and regulating our affairs in accordance with the highest good.

What a relief for the world-weary, battling with the perverse problems of human justice, to realize that there is a law above every mortal law; that God's law discloses every attempt at trickery, dishonesty, or false pretense, every unfair advantage, every hidden motive, every desire to harm, and having uncovered these processes, straightway destroys them, strikes the right balance, and sets free both the oppressor and the oppressed as having been victims of impersonal false beliefs.

Mary Baker Eddy has expressed this correcting influence of the law of adjustment in the following words: "Di-

vine Science adjusts the balance as Jesus adjusted it. Science removes the penalty only by first removing the sin which incurs the penalty. This is my sense of divine pardon, which I understand to mean God's method of destroying sin." (S&H)

"Mary Baker Eddy, Her Spiritual Footsteps," by Gilbert C. Carpenter

Gilbert Carpenter, who lived from April 1905 to April 1906 as a student and secretary at Mary Baker Eddy's home, Pleasant View, in Concord, New Hampshire, seems to have written this book to present a proper view of Mrs. Eddy and some of her "controversial" statements and behaviors. Indeed, he has succeeded here and has produced a powerful spiritual document in the process.

When I first started reading the book, I found it didn't quite meet my expectations, so I set it aside. Then, when I began to read again, I discovered numerous great treasures in its pages. I say that in case you feel, as I did at first, that the book isn't quite what you'd hoped to read, and I'd suggest you read on.

Carpenter's point of view about a woman he quite rightly revered was that she had her reasons for everything she did. Indeed, she had her reasons and those reasons were simply that God Himself had guided her to do as she did, and if she was not guided well, she wanted nothing to do with anything merely humanly inspired.

The author goes through many examples of Mrs. Eddy's actions questioned by others and gives explanations that show her only interest to be that what happened in her home must arise from demonstration and not, instead, from mundane concerns. She was, for instance, severe with the cooks, whose only desire was to serve her something pleasing to her. And here Carpenter notes, flavored with scientific right thinking, cooked with spiritual understanding, and served with a loving consciousness of man's oneness with God.



What Does a Rebuke Have to Do with Love?

Recently it has become clear to me, like never before, that we, as Christian Scientists, don't understand love if we think the only form it takes is kind, compassionate words

or a gentle demeanor. Sometimes the situation requires a real toughness. Sometimes that toughness is perceived as a personal attack and as unloving by the one on the receiving end.

I certainly didn't understand this before finding independent Christian Science, and I have to say that there have been times, when I first worked with the Plainfield Church's practitioners, that they said things to me that I thought were unduly tough — that offended me personally. Typically, the stern times were when I thought they were most off the mark with their comments! The thing is, however, that the more I would think about what they had rebuked in me, the more I realized that they were seeing the "creeping things" that Mrs. Eddy warns us to be intolerant of — personal sense, pride, etc. — that I was entertaining that wasn't good and was hindering my growth.

A few weeks ago, I had reason to re-examine what it means to be "loving" in Christian Science and how that relates to rebuking sin. One night, as I was praying prior to the Wednesday evening testimony service (I was reading the chapter in Science and Health called "Prayer"), the inspiration was jumping off the page. It started with my noticing how much Mrs. Eddy speaks about sin, on uncovering it, repenting of it, and rebuking it. Most of my life I've never thought of having any real "sin" in myself — in Christian Science we learn that we're God's perfect image, so that means we have no sin, right? But if that's the case, then who the heck is Mrs. Eddy talking to in these pages? I thought, if she's not talking to me, who are these people who have to uncover this sinful sense in themselves and destroy it? Who is she speaking of when she talks about "those who only spasmodically come face to face with their own wickedness?" (S&H) I realized that she was talking to me, and to all of us. Sin isn't just the "big" stuff — killing or

stealing or adultery — it's the pride, arrogance, self-righteousness that tries to creep into our everyday walk and talk. It must be weeded out.

The second thing I noticed was how much Mrs. Eddy used the word "rebuke." It's even in the Rule for Motives and Acts: "and a Christian Scientist reflects the sweet amenities of Love in rebuking sin" There the word is coupled with being loving. So I looked up "rebuke" in the 1828 Webster's Dictionary. The definition read: "To check, silence, or put down with reproof; to reprehend sharply and summarily; to reprove; to admonish." None of those definitions sounded very loving to me — at least, not in the way we're often taught what is "loving" in Christian Science.

On page 6 of Science and Health there is a marginal heading that reads "Divine Severity." Here Mrs. Eddy pointedly notes how tough and forceful Jesus was with error. She illustrates how he uncovered and rebuked sin before destroying it. She makes a specific point that he wasn't always gentle and sweet with it, and she gives examples when she talks about "a sick woman . . . whom Satan hath bound," and notes how he said to Peter, "Thou art an offense unto me." (Peter could have taken that really personally and had his feelings hurt.) But Jesus wasn't addressing Peter personally — he was talking to the sin that he'd uncovered in Peter's thought. She then notes that a magistrate living during the time of Jesus described his rebuke as "fearful," and she wraps up by saying his reproof was "pointed and pungent."

Since that night, I look at rebukes a lot differently than I did before. And I'm most grateful that my practitioner has the courage and the love it takes to talk tough to me when she thinks I need it, to snap me out of whatever hold animal magnetism might have on my thought.

Daniel, the Faithful

We can gain much inspiration and encouragement from the characters in the Old Testament who trusted God with their lives and overcame seemingly overwhelming odds against them. Daniel, for instance, spent much of his life with the Israelites in captivity to other nations and kings. Yet, because of his steadfast love for God and trust in God, he was both respected by the governing king and despised by those who were jealous of him.

First, King Nebuchadnezzar put Daniel in charge of the wise men, and put his three friends, Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, in charge of the provinces of Babylon. When their adversaries tricked the king into making a decree requiring everyone to worship the golden statue, his friends faced a tough choice. Would they save their lives by worshipping the statue, or continue to worship only God. The Biblical account is clear that they did not waver in their worship of God, and for that, his friends were thrown into the furnace. The outcome was that they were not hurt, nor was the smell of fire on them. This experience was irrefutable proof that their faithfulness to God was perfect safety.

Later, when King Nebuchadnezzar had a disturbing dream, Daniel was able again to interpret it for him, giving him the bad news that the king would soon lose his kingdom. Daniel did not fear telling the king the truth, even though it would be bad news to him.

Then, when Darius replaced Nebuchadnezzar as king, he knew how wise and trustworthy Daniel was and put him in charge of the presidents and princes of Babylon, which infuriated those who had to report to Daniel. The other presidents tricked Darius into signing a decree to trap Daniel as he prayed to God. Even when Daniel heard about

the decree, he was not impressed or fearful. Daniel had been perfectly consistent in his love for God and the king. He prayed regularly every day. God's commands were written on his heart. He had no pride. He envied no one, and certainly did not entertain hate for anyone, — not the king nor his assailants. He had seen his friends protected in the fiery furnace, and he had complete trust that God would take care of him.

He had conducted himself perfectly in God's sight, and that was his safety. That was also why King Darius preferred him. He felt safe and confident with Daniel because Daniel was obedient to the God that created and governs the universe.

When the persecution came, he did not blink. He didn't negotiate a settlement. There was no compromise with the enemy. The decree written by those who opposed him, and signed by the king, was established out of hate and deceit, and he gave it no credence! When cast into the den of lions, his life of obedience to God was his perfect protection, a great lesson for the king, and a rebuke to his protagonists.

His life should be a great inspiration and encouragement to all of us that unswerving obedience to God is the only perfect safety. It will certainly meet with opposition, but that opposition has no power against the all might of God. We will be tempted to compromise our standards, to "go along with the crowd," to negotiate a "peace," but that is never the path to success or peace. Mary Baker Eddy states in our textbook, "The beliefs we commonly entertain about happiness and life afford no scatheless and permanent evidence of either. Security for the claims of harmonious and eternal being is found only in divine Science." This was the standard of every great prophet, including Daniel. This standard survives today in the lives of those who trust wholeheartedly in God.
