Love is ever present.



We Each Are Special:

A teacher of three and four-year-olds in a Christian Science Sunday School was sharing with them the Bible verse from Psalm 46:10, “Be still, and know that I am God”. Being still, or quiet and calm, was the practical lesson they were learning for this hour.

When it was time to leave their area to join the rest of the Sunday School for prayer and singing, she asked them what they could do to show “quietness”.

One child said, “We could tiptoe.”

So, when their door opened, out came their “quiet” expressions of what “tiptoe” meant to them.

The first child ran out on tiptoes, with arms moving up and down like a ballerina. The second, very carefully, put one foot directly in front of the other, heel to toe. The third marched, with knees up high and fingers pointing straight to the floor. The fourth walked in very slow motion.

Even though their expressions in tiptoeing were all different, all showed that they understood “quietness”, which had been their lesson for this hour.
